

OFF-LEASH AREAS

Unrestricted off-leash areas

The City of Canada Bay has designated specific areas to enable dogs to exercise off leash. Please refer to the map attached. For more information on the specific off-leash areas please visit Council's website www.canadabay.nsw.gov.au

Going on holidays

Make arrangements for your pet while you are away. Pets should not be left alone for extended periods of time, so get a friend to watch your pet or take your pet with you if you can.



Daily exercise requirements

Dogs need daily exercise. A walk each day is essential for good health and good behaviour. Large dogs such as Cattle dogs, Border Collies and Kelpies need more exercise than other dogs. Vigorous runs at an off-leash area are essential. Lack of exercise can lead to undesirable behaviours such as barking, digging and aggression.

Where you can't take your dog

Please remember that dogs are not allowed on or off-leash in:

- Sporting ovals.
- School grounds.
- Child care centres.
- Shopping areas where dogs are prohibited - there will be signs posted.
- Wildlife protection areas.
- Children's play areas - or within 10 metres of these.
- Food preparation and eating areas - or within 10 metres of these.
- Recreation areas where dogs are prohibited - there will be signs posted.
- Public bathing areas where dogs are prohibited - there will be signs posted.

NB: these restrictions do not apply to either Police dogs or a recognised Assistance Animal (Guide dog, hearing Assistance dogs etc).

What if I don't comply?

If you fail to comply with the Companion Animals Act it may lead to the imposition of an on-the-spot fine which ranges from \$165 to \$1760 or legal action.

Off Leash Areas

Permitted any time

Before 9am & after 5pm only
