

## FOOD TRUCK TRIAL

Globally, there is a trend to encourage Food trucks. They provide an innovative approach to street food and are attractive and sustainable. Food trucks activate spaces, bring people together and provide an exciting range of food choices in areas with limited options.

The City of Canada Bay is proposing a trial of Sydney City Food trucks in the city during Spring 2015 and Summer 2016.

The objective of the trial is to provide existing licenced food truck operators in the City of Sydney the opportunity to operate on a trial basis at selected sites throughout the City of Canada Bay to determine the viability of establishing a food truck program.

The trial aims is to encourage activation of parks and places and to allow the public to experience a broader range of food and dining experiences. The trial will also provide food truck operators an opportunity to trial various food concepts and site options.

Existing licenced food truck operators in the City of Sydney have been invited to participate in the trial and a partnership to enable Council to advertise availability on the Sydney City Food trucks app has been established.

Food truck operators who participate in the trial will also be invited to promote their service on the City of Canada Bay website.

Approved operators will not be charged an application or licence fees during the trial.

All food truck operators participating in the trial are required to submit evidence that they are currently licenced under the Sydney Food truck program ( compliance with the Food Standards Code, Food regulation 2010, Guidelines for Mobile Vending Vehicles and adhere to Construction and Food Handling Guidelines) and are subject of inspection by the City of Canada Bay.



## Frequently asked questions

### What is a food truck?

Food trucks provide a broad range of cuisines and beverages from a menu and can trade for a maximum period of 4 hours on a trial site. Food trucks are essentially a kitchen on wheels, for example, a gourmet food truck serving made to order hot food such as tacos. **Alcohol cannot be sold.**

### When will the trial be undertaken?

The trial period will be **Tuesday 1 September – Monday 30 November 2015** at sites in Rhodes Foreshore Park and Cabarita Park.

**Should the trial prove successful it will be extended to Monday 29 February 2016 and additional sites will be offered at Bayview Park in Concord and Taplin Park in Drummoyne.**
