

What are the aims of the fund?

The aims of the Heritage Assistance Fund are to:

- Encourage work on heritage items and in heritage conservation areas within the City of Canada Bay
- Assist in reconstruction of missing details to heritage items and encourage conservation work that enhances the public domain within the City of Canada Bay
- Engender greater interest and awareness for conservation of heritage sites within the City of Canada Bay
- Promote a positive community attitude towards heritage conservation within the City of Canada Bay.

Council is committed to the conservation of local built heritage, and to further assist owners Council has established a Local Heritage Assistance Fund.

- The Fund provides dollar for dollar funding to successful applicants for small conservation works.
- Up to \$3,000 is available for work to properties that are heritage items.
- Up to \$2,000 is available for work to contributory buildings in a heritage conservation area.
- For this financial year, there is a total of \$32,000 in funding to be distributed.



The new procedure

The new procedure is based on approval of funding after completion of works. Applications can be received at any time and will be assessed for approval by our Heritage Advisor every three (3) months. Applicants should:

- Read the Local Heritage Assistance Fund Guidelines and complete the Application Form
- Provide “before and after” works colour photographs
- Provide evidence of costs (invoices) and where relevant, sketches of work/plans.

What projects are eligible for funding?

To be eligible for funding the work must be undertaken on a heritage item or on a contributory building within a conservation area listed in the City of Canada Bay Local Environmental Plan, 2013.

Applicants are encouraged to contact our Heritage Advisor prior to work being completed to confirm whether projects are appropriate for funding. Proceeding with works prior to discussions with our Heritage Advisor could result in ineligibility.

What projects are ineligible for funding?

Funding will generally not be provided to the following projects:

- New additions to a heritage building or contributory building in a heritage conservation area
- Internal fittings such as new kitchens or bathrooms
- Where substantial assistance has previously been provided or where the applicant has yet to complete other projects
- The purchase of a building or item
- Relocation of a heritage item or a contributory building in a conservation area
- Work on a relocated building
- Work on a government owned building that is still being used for a government purpose
- Purchase of tools or plants
- Works associated with a DA
